2024 State Election Results

As of November 6, 2024

While it will take several days to count our state's ballots, here are the results as of the morning after the election:

- State Democratic Sen. Patty Kuderer will become the next Insurance Commissioner, replacing five-term incumbent Mike Kreidler who chose to retire.
- In the Governor's race, Attorney General Bob Ferguson has a 56%-44% margin over former GOP U.S. Congressman and King County Sheriff Dave Reichert.
- Democrats will maintain control of all nine statewide offices. Cruising to victory in the Attorney General's race is former Western Washington U.S. Attorney Democrat Nick Brown. In the race for Commissioner of Public Lands, Democratic King County Councilmember Dave Upthegrove has a comfortable lead over former GOP U.S. Congresswoman Jaime Herrera Beutler. Incumbent Superintendent of Public Instruction Chris Reykdal is headed toward re-election.
- Senate Democrats are poised to add three seats to their 29-20 majority, but all three races are too close to call. House Democrats will increase their 58-40 majority, picking up one seat with two GOP-held seats remaining too close to call.
- Of the four ballot initiatives, three are headed for defeat and one is leading. Likely to pass is I-2066, which protects the use of natural gas. The three losing initiatives are I-2109, a repeal of the state's 7% capital gains tax; I-2117, a repeal of the state's carbon trading marketplace; and I-2124, which allowed people to opt out of mandatory participation in the state's long-term health care insurance program.

Federal Races

- U.S. Senate: Incumbent Democrat U.S. Sen. Maria Cantwell has defeated Republican Dr. Raul Garcia.
- 3rd District: Incumbent Democratic Rep. Marie Gluesenkamp Perez is leading over GOP challenger Joe Kent. This race is among the top five Congressional races in the nation as Congressional House Republicans strive to maintain their slim majority.
- 4th District: In this Republican-versus-Republican race, Rep. Dan Newhouse is leading against Trump-endorsed GOP challenger Jerrod Sessler. Newhouse is one of the ten House Republicans who voted to impeach former President Trump.
- 5th District: In this open seat race to replace GOP Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers, Spokane County Treasurer Michael Baumgartner has defeated Democratic candidate Carmela Conroy.
- 6th District: Democratic state Sen. Emily Randall has defeated GOP state Sen. Drew MacEwen.

State House Races

- LD 10 – Democratic-held seat, Island and Skagit counties/North Puget Sound Democratic: Rep. Clyde Shavers has defeated Republican challenger Carrie Kennedy
- LD 14 – Republican-held open seat, Greater Yakima area/Central Washington GOP: Gloria Mendoza has defeated Democrat Chelsea Dimas.
- LD 14 – Republican-held open seat, Greater Yakima area/Central Washington: Deb Manjarrez has defeated Ana Ruiz Kennedy.
- LD 17 – Republican-held open seat, Suburban Vancouver/SW Washington: Democratic Terri Niles has a slight lead over GOP candidate Dave Stuebe in a race that's too close to call.
- LD 18 – Republican-held open seat, Suburban Vancouver/SW Washington Republican John Ley is leading Democrat John Zingale in a race that is also too close to call.
- LD 26 - Republican-held open seat, Gig Harbor Peninsula, South Puget Sound: Democrat Addison Richards has defeated former GOP. Rep Jesse Young.
- LD 42 - Democratic-held seat, Bellingham area/North Puget Sound: Democrat Rep. Joe Timmons is returning to the Capitol with a win over Republican challenger Kamal Bhachu.

State Senate Races

- LD 10 – Republican-held seat, Island and Skagit counties/North Puget Sound: GOP Sen. Ron Muzzall is losing to Democratic challenger Janet St. Clair, but the race is too close to call.
- LD 14 – Republican-held seat, Greater Yakima area/Central Washington: Incumbent Republican Sen. Curtis King has defeated Democratic candidate Maria Beltran.
- LD 17 – Republican-held open seat, Suburban Vancouver/SW Washington: GOP Rep. Paul Harris has a slight lead over Democratic candidate Marla Keethler in a race that is too close to call.
- LD 18 – Republican-held open seat, Suburban Vancouver/SW Washington: Democrat Adrian Cortez leads GOP candidate Brad Benton, but this is another race that's too close to call.
